You connect generations to a common cause.




What is Compassion Sunday?

Compassion Sunday mobilizes your church to activate the Great Commission so that every child has the chance to meet Jesus and be released from poverty in all its forms.

During your church service, your congregation will be invited to put their faith into action by sponsoring waiting children living in poverty. The event usually involves:

- A message or short testimony from you or a Compassion sponsor in your congregation.
- A short video highlighting the hope a sponsor can bring to a child's life.
- A call to action inviting your congregation to sponsor a child.
- A sign-up table where people can choose a child to sponsor.

Whether you or a volunteer hosts Compassion Sunday, we'll provide all the support you need to make this leap of faith one you'll be thankful for!

The couple transformed Normandia, Bolivia, from a garbage dump into a thriving community through their partnership with Compassion.



A Program That Works

Research proves it. Sponsorship connects vulnerable children to ultimate hope and practical care as they journey out of poverty.

Take a look! When compared to youth who were not part of Compassion's program, Compassion youth were:

284% more likely to be in school (Tanzania, aged 12-14).

63% more likely to attend church regularly (Peru, aged 15-17)

91% more likely to evangelize (Ecuador, aged 16-18)

47% more likely to have at least one income-generating skill (Indonesia, aged 16-18)

80% more likely to pray in desire for a relationship with God (El Salvador, youth)

45% more likely to disciple others (El Salvador, youth)

How to Take Action

- Decide the role you will play in the event: simply introduce the Compassion Sunday host or take a more active part. Note: We've learned that the most impactful events are those where the pastor leads the way.
